FROM THE DIRECTOR:

In Leadership, we are reading Max Lucado's book In the Eye of the Storm. One of the chapters we read this week was called "Doubtstorms". Lucado stated that when we have doubtstorms, we should think of ways in which God's hand still moves. One of the examples Lucado gave was of a husband whose wife had had cancer for five years, and yet he was still by her side, feeding her, loving her, and taking care of her.

In contrast to the above, a minister friend of mine told me a story, before I started doing premarital counseling, about a woman who had come down with multiple sclerosis and whose ability to function was quickly deteriorating. Her husband was really struggling to deal with the changes in *his* life as well as in hers. As time went on and his wife's health continued to decline, his co-workers encouraged him to get on with his life by seeing another woman; and he soon did just that.

Although this man broke his wedding vows, which is very troubling in itself, the more disturbing fact to me is the acceptance, and even *encouragement*, he received from his co-workers, people who were not even emotionally involved in the situation. Worldly voices might whisper, "Oh, there's nothing more you can do for this person." But our wedding vows tell a different story--a story of Christ's commitment to us: that when we are sick, He will be by our side; when we are at our worst, He will forgive us; when we are poor, He will fill us with the richness of His love.

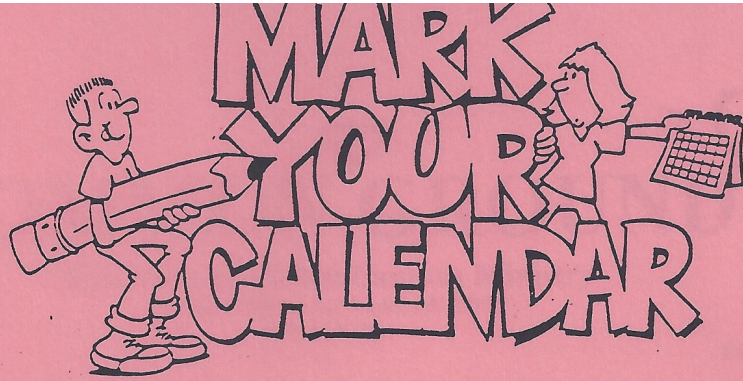

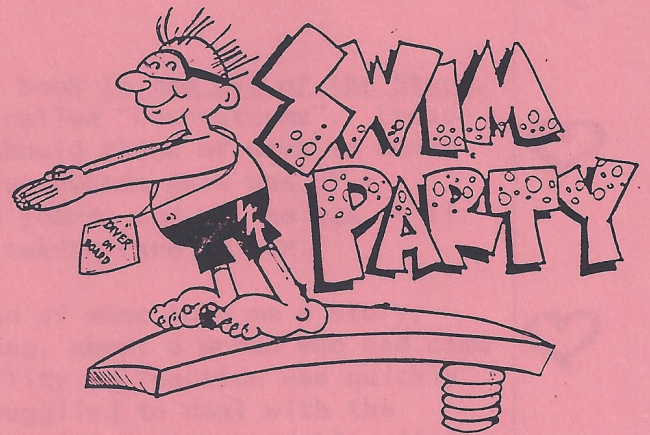
