How Much is Enough?


When I was a young man of about 23, I made a commitment to myself that I did not want to make more than \$1,000.00 a month without giving the excess away. Unfortunately, this goal withered because it was unclear if this included business expenses or not. At the time I was a traveling musician and spent a great deal of money to make phone calls, write letters, buy gas, tapes, etc. Yet, my commitment was not in vain; it set a standard for my life that at some point "enough was enough".

I have since made more than \$1,000.00 a month and cannot remember the details of the commitment (if there were any). I have prayed and feel quite comfortable with how much I am paid. You might ask, "Why make such a silly commitment?". At the time, I lived with my parents and did not pay rent. I had very little debt other than a car payment. My desire was to let God know that I needed a simple living and no more.

In a recent *Money* magazine article, it talked about how rich Bill Gates is: owning approximately \$51 billion in Microsoft stock. The story said that if Mr. Gates funded a manned mission to Mars costing \$25 billion dollars, bailed out Russia at \$12.5 billion dollars, repaid Chicago's public schools at \$3 billion dollars, he would still have \$10.5 billion dollars left, making him the seventh richest person in the country.

I am not putting down Bill Gates and I am quite aware that he has given a great deal of money to worthwhile causes. But still the question remains, "How much is enough? How much is *too much*?". Looking back, I may have been too idealistic about the \$1,000.00 figure. I also realize that what one needs as a single person changes when one gets married, starts a family, and takes on additional responsibilities.
