There is only one problem--I have not had time or made the time to get the various components linked up. In our spiritual lives, we also have powerful resources with which to make better lives for ourselves; things which we know link us up to God. One of these things is the Bible. This is God's communication to us, telling us about His Son Jesus Christ and the stories about how God has dealt with the Saints of the past. As it says in 2 Timothy 3:16-17: "All scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking,

Jesus said, in Matthew 4:19: "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of [people]." We show our dedication to God by sharing our faith with others. He communicates with us by acting in their lives.

All of these communication links need to be "hooked up" to work. It takes time each day to keep the lines of communication open. By keeping these lines open, we show our obedience to God and our openness to doing what He commands. Let us, in our lives, listen to God communicating with us and respond to His commandments with obedience.
