## Missions in Aganda

I cannot believe that summer is drawing to a close. My time spent in the African country of Uganda was precious and Godfilled. The five weeks that we spent on the ground have changed me not only as a person, but as a follower of Christ

We spent the first part of our trip in Kampala, the capital city of Uganda. This city is in the southern part of the country, bordering Lake Victoria. It is a dusty city. Everything quickly became covered in a thin film of fine red dirt. That was where we met the Ugandan staff and students we worked with. The first three days of orientation in Kampala sewed seeds of lifelong friendships between the two groups.

In Kampala, we spent time at two different mission sites. The majority of my time was spent at Rhema Academic Centre, a primary school that offers free tuition and fees for those students whose families are unable to pay for their children's education. While at Rhema, I spent a great deal of my time with the fifth and sixth graders. Each day that I spent with these students was unique and beautiful. I have had the pleasure and the blessing to be able to stay in touch with them through the teachers at Rhema: Jacinta and Peter. During our final weekend in Kampala, we spent Saturday at Rhema hosting a field day and church service with the children. It will always be a beautiful memory, walking in and being dogpiled by these bright-eyed and happy children.

It was a tearful farewell as we left Rhema that evening. However, the next part of our journey was to begin.

The second half of our work took place in Lukodi, a village just north of Gulu. Within this village, there is one little girl I will never forget. Her name is Sophia, and her mother is Lilly. Sophia stands out in my mind because she is the oldest of the children. She goes to primary school in Lukodi, and is a bright eyed and beautiful child full of energy. The rest of the children were preschool and infant age. It was not until the last few days of the trip that Sophia opened up to more than just chasing games and throwing a ball around. The evenings were spent in worship in the circle created by the huts. It was during these last few nights of worship that this spunky seven-yearold stayed by my side, attempting to teach me to dance, and playing drums with me. The second to last night, Sophia, as tall as she was, wanted me to pick her up. The last night she fell asleep in my arms as we sat off to the side and watched the dancing and worship with a few of the others. I will never forget the look of her face in the moonlight, peaceful and happy. This little girl who mostly just played but would never hug any of us, was asleep in my lap with her head on my chest. My heart felt as if it would burst with the love of God for this child. She stole my heart, my love. And I was able to pray over her in the moonlight that she grow up in a peaceful village, full of the love and beauty and grace of God -Brayden Stewart
